Welcome to the latest news from the Newburgh Museum! Lots of exciting changes are underway at the museum. Come visit us at our new location, 503 State Street on Friday and Saturday from 11 am – 3 pm. Beginning in May the museum will implement a new speaker series: "Remember When" the first Sunday of every month from 1-3 pm. **February 7th** we open our latest exhibit, Concoctions, Potions and Elixirs-Newburgh Druggist. We have actually built a small drugstore inside the museum creating a composite of nine early drug stores that existed in the early 1900's. There are items actually used by a pharmacist such as old apothecary jars, never-opened salesman samples of drugs and compounds, a 1913 Oliver typewriter and many other items. Included in the drugstore is a small version of a soda shop with syrup dispensers, an early shake machine and other items. Old time boxes of candy and candy bars are in an old time glass display case. Learn how soda shops were different from ice cream shops. A collection of teapots are a part of this exhibit. Tea was used for medicinal purposes years ago and still is today.

Join us on **February 15th** for an Exhibit Reception. At 2:15 "Tea Talk with Gina" from Mulberry Jeans will highlight how tea was and is used as healing properties. Mulberry Jeans has been selling loose leaf teas for years and is experts on how different teas can be used for different remedies. The museum partners with Mulberry Jeans on the items in the gift shop. You can buy a tea pot or essential oils as well as many other items. You can scoop up some penny candy as you enjoy light refreshments during "Tea Talk with Gina".
